Starting with Offense Conduct, the manual covers Adjustments, Criminal History and Criminal Livelihood, Determining the Sentence, Sentencing Procedures, Plea Agreements, and Crime Victims' Rights, Violations of Probation and Supervised Release and Sentencing of Organizations.
